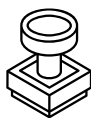

2023 Accomplishments

105,169 duplicated individuals, 10,324 distinct individuals, and 5,953 distinct households received services from SVH

These numbers only include the Social Services and Clinic numbers. Family Service Center and Galveston-Houston Immigration Representation Project (GHIRP) numbers are not included.



Transportation/Bus Service

Over 3,100 rides given to friends and neighbors in Galveston City limits

Comprehensive Vision Program

137 examinations by Prevent Blindness Texas & Sight for All with Dr. Mehta, a volunteer Optometrist

Patients are referred from clinics that are diabetics and chronically ill and in need of free eye examinations and glasses



2023 Accomplishments



Galveston Diaper Bank

Over 2 million baby & adult incontinence supplies distributed

The Galveston Diaper Bank partnered with St. Vincent's House in order to be more impactful in reaching individuals and families in need. We served 801 distinct babies and 215 individuals.

Drive Thru Narcan Dispensary

Averaging 90 of Narcan Distributed each month

We became the 1st Drive Thru Narcan Dispensary in Galveston in 2023, distributing 500 units thus far.

Galveston County is the #2 place for Fentanyl related deaths in Texas. Narcan is the only medication that can save a life in a matter of seconds.



Expanded Food & HygienePantry

Our comprehensive pantry includes cleaning & hygiene supplies, child & adult diapers as well as fruits & vegetables.

8,239 Snack Packs Distributed to 846 self-identified unsheltered individuals

- Galveston County Food Bank Top Distributing Pantry
- 6,231 distinct individuals were served through the pantry
- 17,925 duplicated individuals received groceries
- Over 50 homebound seniors received Christmas goodie bags
- Averaging 130 new families signing up each month
- 83% of pantry clients are referred to at least one of our many services or partners

Completed 5,943 Homebound Food Deliveries, averaging 122 weekly home deliveries for families and seniors that are homebound or do not have transportation

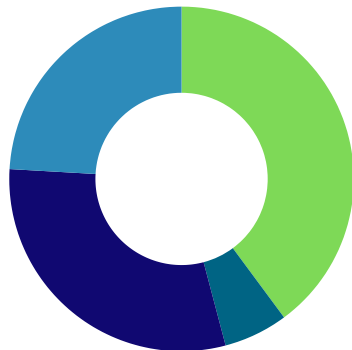

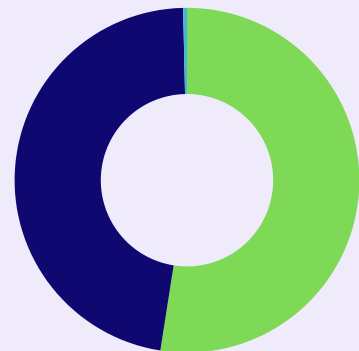

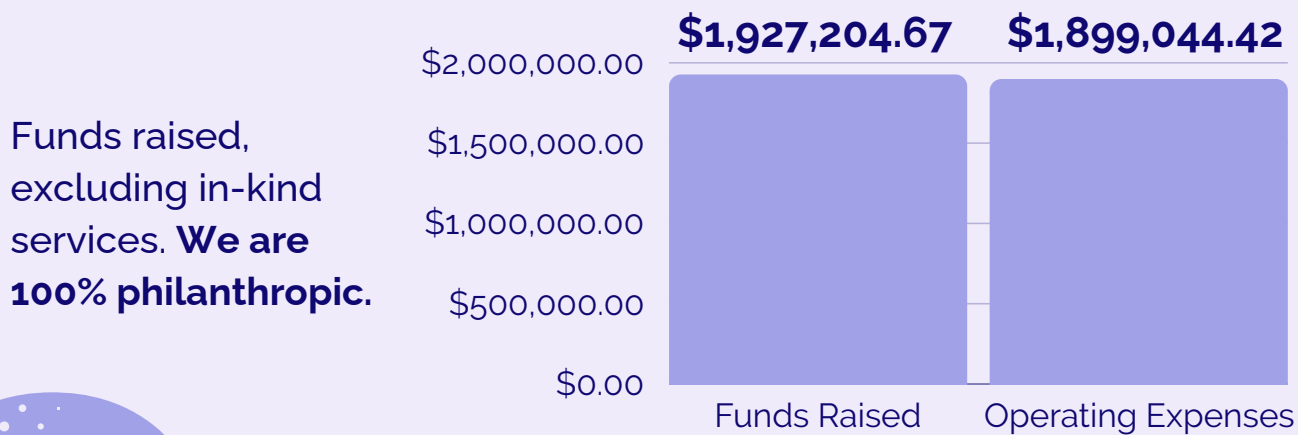

A STORY OF HOPE

Bob's journey has been one of struggle and determination. Once employed full-time as an architect, difficult times hit as he was diagnosed with cancer. At 78, Bob faced an impossible choice: housing or funding his crucial cancer treatments. Bob's, landlord, aware of his battle, raised his rent and he was given an eviction notice. His gas was also shut off, so he had to shower in cold water. Bob felt hopeless and reached out to St. Vincent's House, and the team was able to help find him a new home and get back on his feet. Bob is now a local artist and sells his paintings when he is able. Bob gifted Amber, one of our dedicated case managers, a painting titled 'HOPE.' It is a symbol of gratitude for the lifeline and HOPE he was provided. His words echo in our hearts:
